Our museum is situated in the former Kesselhaus of the TELDEC, the only building that survived from times, when the company was one of the largest and most established record manufacturer in Germany.

Not less than 850 million shellac and later vinyl records were pressed in the production halls until 1987. At peak times more than 1000 people were employed at TELDEC in Nortorf.
